

## Introduction to Project Management Course

### Overview

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The Introduction to Project Management course was designed as an introductory course for individuals who are new to project management or are looking to formalize their project management knowledge. This classroom course is conducted over 1 day and provides students with the knowledge and understanding necessary to go on and successfully work on and manage projects.

### Course Outcome

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The Introduction to Project Management course provides students with an introduction to the main concepts and theories of project management. Upon completion of the course students should be comfortable working as part of a project or managing a project. Students will also be ready to undertake further certification level study such as PRINCE2® or the PMBOK® based courses.

### Who should attend?

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This course is suitable for:

- Project Managers
- Team Managers
- Team Members
- PMO staff
- Project support staff
- Senior Managers overseeing project/program teams
- Plus anyone interested in project/program work

### Entry Requirements

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This is an open course with no pre-requisite qualifications. Any experience in project teams would be beneficial.

### What are PMBOK and PRINCE2?

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The PMBOK® is the Project Management Institute's publication, "A Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge". It is the internationally recognised publication that has been guiding project managers for decades. PRINCE2® is currently the most popular project management methodology being used by project managers. This course has been developed with both the PMBOK and PRINCE2 in mind.

## Course Content

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The course covers the core concepts of project management from starting a project through the execution of the project and project closure. Participants will apply the theory against a case study during the course to help build confidence in their application of the theory. Work during the course will be conducted on an individual and team basis.

Participants will work through the project lifecycle from initiating a project through to closing a project. During this journey they will consider all key aspects of project management theory including:
